

INTRODUCTION

This report summarises all records of species which occurred in Canberra Ornithologists Group's area of concern' as defined in the *Field List of the Birds of Canberra and District*, (3rd edition, 1985), between 1 July 1985 and 30 June 1986. (See map page 34).

A total of 226 species was recorded during this period. All category 3 records as defined in the Field List have been vetted by the COG Rarities Committee. Records for which no documentation has been received have been placed within square brackets.

The names and sequence of birds conform with the RAOU's 'Recommended English Names for Australian Birds', *Emu* 77, Supplement (May 1978), with order and family groupings arranged according to convenience.

The status assigned to species listed in the report have been further revised and refined to present the most accurate picture possible. Thorough revision of the status of all birds of the Canberra area will be done when data from the ACT Bird Atlas Project become available.

The status of each species has been given in an abbreviated form. The conventional definition of each status is given in CBN 9(3),53. The status of each bird consists of two elements, abundance and breeding status, separated by a period. For meanings of abbreviations see p.42.

For the sake of economy, duplication of data in this report has been minimised. The Garden Bird Survey (GBS) summary table is restricted to the most common species and Waterbird Survey (WBS) data has not been repeated for each lake separately within the Introduction, only the total numbers of species and individuals per survey are shown for each lake. In the body of the report, records of an individual species are listed chronologically, and are not divided into WBS, GBS, Other, etc. This integration of records should make the report easier to use than previous reports.


Numbers and distribution of birds within the species list are often compared with that of the previous year. Therefore unless stated otherwise a statement such as 'overall numbers lower' is to be interpreted as, in comparison with the previous years' Annual Bird Report (ABR). Likewise an addendum or corrigendum refers to previous ABR(s).




HIGHLIGHTS

The highlights of the 1985-86 birdwatching year in the Canberra area include the following:

- The first record of a Grey Plover.
- The second record of a Ruddy Turnstone.
- $\bullet\ \ \$ The first breeding records for Brown Quail and Diamond Dove.
- Notable breeding records for Musk Duck, Whistling Kite, Powerful Owl, White's Thrush, Red-capped Robin, Hooded Robin and Spotted Quail-thrush.
- An influx of Cattle Egrets between March and May 1986.
- Record numbers of Freckled Duck (500), Pink-eared Duck (2000) and Red-necked Avocet (150) on Lake Bathurst.
- A continued increase in the numbers of Maned Duck with a record number of 1600 on Lake Burley Griffin.
- The discovery of substantial numbers of Yellow Thornbills in
 - the Murrumbidgee River Corridor, where the species is a moderately common breeding resident. It was previously considered uncommon in the ACT.
- Records of the following rarities: Black Kite, Grey Goshawk, Black Falcon, Common Sandpiper, Gull-billed Tern, Common Koel, Channel-billed Cuckoo, White-throated Nightjar, Black- faced Monarch, Brown Gerygone and Tawny-crowned Honeyeater.
- Regular records of the following uncommon species: Little Bittern, Blue-billed Duck, White-bellied Sea-Eagle (Mar-Apr), Peaceful Dove, Crested Pigeon and Lesser Golden Ployer.
- Regular records of Indian Mynas from suburban Inner Northside, indicating a continued spread of this species.
- General stability in the numbers and distribution of most species of garden birds since 1984-85.

The Waterbird Survey (WBS) data were collected in visits every two months to the urban lakes and monthly visits to Lake Bathurst. Several visits were made to the northern end of Lake George. Data from the silt-trap on Tuggeranong Ck and Village Dam on Village Ck are included under the heading Tuggeranong Lakes. As in 1984-85, water levels of Lake Bathurst and Lake George rose to a peak in spring and declined again thereafter (see Fig. 2). Lake George was dry from April onwards.

Throughout the body of this report, waterbird numbers shown in parentheses indicate incomplete data, that is, where the lake was only partially surveyed.

GARDEN BIRD SURVEY

The Garden Bird Survey is based on data collected on Garden Bird Charts. A description of survey techniques may be found in CBN 8(1),5. Ninety-four charts were received for 1985-86, 89 of which were analysed. Four charts were received from country areas. Data from these were incorporated into the report but were excluded from the GBS analysis as trends in country areas may be different from those in the city. One chart was received too late for inclusion. Survey sites are shown in Fig. 3. Sixty-two of these sites were also surveyed in 1984-85.

The following variables are shown for most species:

A - is the average number of birds of a particular species seen per garden per week. A is calculated by adding all weekly observations of a particular species and dividing the sum by

the total number of weeks during which observations were made (3517). E.g. A=5.1 indicates that an average of 5.1 birds of that species was recorded per garden per week throughout the year. Each garden area is approx. 3.1 ha.


- F is the number of gardens in which the species was recorded at least once, expressed as the percentage of all gardens. If a species is described as 'F=10%', it was recorded at least once in 10% of gardens.
- W is the number of weeks during which the species was recorded. Resident species such as the Australian Magpie are present 52 weeks of the year (W=52); but a migrant such as the Pallid Cuckoo is only present during 26 weeks (W=26).
- R is the recording rate, i.e., the number of observer-weeks on which a species was recorded, divided by the total number of observer-weeks (3517), expressed as a percentage. E.g., the Common Starling was recorded during nearly three-quarters of observer-weeks (R=73%). This means that on a typical chart, one could expect to record starlings on 73% of weeks during which observations were made.
- B In 1985-86, a total of 54 charts contained breeding data for at least one species. This variable has been introduced to measure the relative frequency of breeding for a given species. The number of sites at which breeding activity was recorded (nests with eggs or young, and/or dependent fledglings) is expressed as a percentage of the total number of charts which contain any breeding data (54). It is only given for species where breeding was recorded, elsewhere of course it equals zero.

The values described above have only been provided for those species which were recorded fairly frequently or regularly. These statistical analyses would not be valid for the species recorded only occasionally.

The first and last records of nests (n) and dependent fledglings (f) are given and the areas where breeding activity was recorded are also listed. Similar data for previous years may be found in CBN 11(2),26-88 and CBN 12(1),8-13.

Records are given in the following form: number of individuals/date, place (observer). Eg. 5/16 May, Woden (JB) indicates 5 birds on 16 May at Woden and JB was the observer. GBS data are often in the form '2w May' where '2w' etc stands for the second GBS week of that particular month. The dates of each GBS week are shown at the top of the GBS chart and listed in CBN 12(1), 13.

The relative abundance (A), frequency (F), weeks present (W) and recording rate (R) of the 45 commonest species and the percent change on 1984-85 (dA, dF, dW, dR) are shown in Table 3. Histograms indicate the average number of individuals recorded in each GBS survey area per month.
