#### INTRODUCTION AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

This Annual Bird Report summarises all records of species that occurred in the Canberra region between 1 July 1988 and 30 June 1989. The "Canberra region" is defined in A Field List of the Birds of Canberra and District, (3rd Edition, 1985). See also the map on page 71.

There were 216 species recorded during the period. All Status 3 records, as defined in the Field List, have been

examined and accepted by the COG Rarities Panel.

Ian Baird compiled the data from the Garden Bird Survey and wrote the survey summary. The following members assisted with encoding data into computer readable format from the original charts, Wally Brown, Martin Butterfield, Malcolm Fyfe, Katy Mallett, Rod Morphett and David Purchase. Philip Veerman presented the statistics in table form. Glenda Jackman summarised the breeding records and McComas Taylor made available his program for calculating the statistics.

The Waterbird Survey data were made available by Michael Lenz (Lake Bathurst, Lake George, Lake Ginninderra and Lake Burley Griffin) and Jack Holland (Lake Tuggeranong).

Hugh Possingham, McComas Taylor and Bryan FitzGerald extracted information of particular interest from the ACT

Bird Atlas project and the miscellaneous records.

Contributors to the Highlights and to the Systematic List were Ian Baird, Graham Browning, Grahame Clark, Bob Digan, Malcolm Fyfe, Bill Graham, Michael Lenz, Brendan Lepschi, Hugh Possingham and David Purchase.

The Table of Water Levels was produced from data supplied by the Groundwater Program of the Bureau of Mineral Resources. Rainfall and Temperature graphs were prepared by Frank Knight from data supplied by the Canberra Meteorological Office.

#### HIGHLIGHTS

The highlights of the 1988-1989 year in the Canberra region included the following:


the sighting of a Black-necked Stork Xenorhynchus

- two breeding records for the Australasian Shoveler Anas rhynchotis, one of them at Lake Tuggeranong
- the third record for the region of the Ruddy Turnstone

- a series of records of the Pectoral Sandpiper *Calidris* melanotos from Lake Bathurst, with up to four birds. These are the first records of this species from the Waterbird Survey
- the first confirmed breeding records for the Australian Crake Porzana fluminea, Brown Songlark Cinclorhamphus cruralis and Satin Bowerbird Ptilonorhynchus violaceus
- a marked decline in the abundance of the Spotted

  Pardalote Pardalotus punctatus, the Striated Pardalote

  P. striatus and the Double-barred Finch Poephila

  bichenovii
- the sighting of a Spangled Drongo *Dicrurus hottentottus* on Mt Majura.
- further sightings of the Masked Woodswallow Artamus personatus and Pied Butcherbird Cracticus nigrogularis
- an influx of the White-browed Woodswallow Artamus



#### GARDEN BIRD SURVEY

The Garden Bird Survey data are derived from standard charts on which COG members recorded observations on a weekly basis at sites throughout suburban Canberra. Observers record the maximum number of each species seen at any one time during a week within a radius of 100 metres of their home or workplace. A detailed description of the Garden Bird Survey method may be found in Canberra Bird Notes 8(1):5. Fifty-six charts were received for 1988-89 (13 fewer than in the previous year). These 56 sites are mapped in Fig. 1.

For species recorded with sufficient frequency, descriptive statistics have been calculated:

- A a measure of abundance, is the average maximum number of individuals of a species recorded at a site for each week over the full year. A is obtained by adding all weekly observations of a species and dividing the sum by the total number of weeks during which observations were made (ie there were 2342 observer-weeks this year). If A=5.1 then on average, 5.1 individuals of that species were recorded each week, at each site, over the full year.
- F a measure of distribution, is the number of sites at which a species was recorded at least once expressed as a percentage of the total number of sites (ie 56 sites this year). If F=25% then a species has been recorded, at least once, at 14 sites (25 per cent of all sites).



- W is the number of weeks in the year for which a species has been recorded at any site. A resident species such as the Australian Magpie-lark is present throughout the year (W=52 weeks); whereas a migrant such as the Dollarbird may only be present for 22 weeks (ie W=22).
- R a measure of the recording rate, is the number of weeks during which a species was recorded expressed as a percentage of the total number of observer-weeks (2342). For example, the Australian Magpie was recorded during 80 per cent of the observer-weeks (R=80.7%). This means that the Australian Magpie was recorded for 80 per cent of weeks for which observations of any species were made.
- G is the average number of individuals of a species recorded in each observation. For example, the calculated G value for the Silver Gull is 42.3 which indicates it is usually observed in large flocks.

The values of A, F, W, R, and G for 121 species are recorded in Table 1 together with the percentage change in these values when compared with the 1987-88 data. The species are sorted in descending order, using the A statistic, giving a list with the most abundant species appearing first. Histograms showing the average A statistic for each month are included for species for which there were 30 or more observations. The greatest monthly A value has been used to label the y axis of each histogram. Therefore, when comparing abundance values for different years and/or species allowance should be made for differences in the vertical scale.

When sufficient data were available breeding records giving the first and last nest and/or fledgling records have been included.

#### WATERBIRD SURVEY

As in previous years the Waterbird Survey data were collected during monthly visits to Lake Bathurst and Lake George (the latter from March onwards) and visits every second month to urban lakes. Throughout this Report a reference to Lake Tuggeranong includes the silt-trap on Tuggeranong Creek, Village Dam on Village Creek, the water quality control pond at Point Hut and Isabella Pond.

In the tables included in this Report waterbird numbers which are underlined indicate that the lake was only partly surveyed. Figures in bold italics indicate breeding (non-flying young Present but their numbers not included in totals).

Flooding of formerly dry areas of Lake George in April/May attracted a substantial number of waterbirds for a short period. At both natural lakes, Lake Bathurst and Lake George, bird numbers had declined dramatically by the end of the reporting period (June 1989). After the heavy and widespread rainfall birds had most likely moved to wetlands outside of our area.


#### ACT BIRD ATLAS PROJECT AND MISCELLANEOUS RECORDS

In addition to the results of the Garden Bird Survey and Waterbird Survey, the Annual Bird Report has traditionally been the means of publishing miscellaneous records. 1988-89 was the final year of the ACT Bird Atlas project and almost all records within the ACT found their way into the Atlas database. Altogether 2244 record sheets were submitted to the Atlas project for the year 1988-89.

The Atlas project survey was based on a grid system in which each grid was a  $2.5\,^{\circ}$  by  $2.5\,^{\circ}$  rectangle. Where necessary the location of a record is referred to or clarified by a grid number, eg "Gr 72". The location of the grids in relation to the ACT is shown in Fig. 2.

The total number of breeding and non-breeding records has been extracted from the database for each species. Interesting records have been listed, particularly breeding records. We recommend that this report be read in conjunction with the maps of the fifth interim Atlas results (Taylor 1990). Note however, that the maps summarize results for the entire three-year period of the Atlas project.

A small number of miscellaneous records from outside the ACT are included. We hope that the formation of the new database scheme covering the enlarged COG region will encourage members to improve the coverage of areas outside the ACT.



#### EXPLANATIONS

The names and sequence of birds in the Systematic List conform to the RAOU "Recommended English Names for Australian Birds", *Emu* 77, Supplement (May 1978) and with order and family groupings arranged according to convenience.

For this Report the status of the species has not been included. The Project Sub-committee believes that, with the results of projects indicating a need to revise some previously held views on the status of certain species within the Canberra region, it would be preferable to omit this feature pending completion of a thorough review of all available information.

As applicable, information relating to each species is in the sequence: Garden Bird Survey (GBS), Waterbird Survey (WBS), ACT Bird Atlas project (Atlas) and miscellaneous records (Misc).

Records are set out in the following format: number of individuals/date, place (observer). For example, "5/10 May LBGE (BlJ)", indicates 5 birds on 10 May at Lake Burley Griffin East and the observer was Joe Bloggs. An "n" (nest) or "fle" (fledgling) or other abbreviation as appropriate, may take the place of the number of individuals.


Garden Bird Survey data are often in the form "2wk May", "2wk" referring to the second week of the month. The dates of each week are shown at the top of the Survey chart and are listed in *Canberra Bird Notes* 12(1):13.


Note that ACT Bird Atlas data do not, for the most part, include date of month or number of individuals. Since Atlas data were compiled primarily on a presence basis such detail is included only in respect of less common species, for which reports were submitted to the Rarities Panel, or of breeding records.

Numbers and distribution of birds within the species list are often compared with the previous year. Therefore, unless indicated otherwise, a statement in this report such as "overall numbers lower" should be taken to mean lower than in 1987-88.

In this Report the words "record(s)" and "observation(s)" are not used to indicate the number of birds involved. Where appropriate the number of individuals has been included.

Abbreviations are explained on page 82. Observers are identified by codes which have been developed for use in both the Annual Bird Report and the COG Database. These are detailed on page 83.


