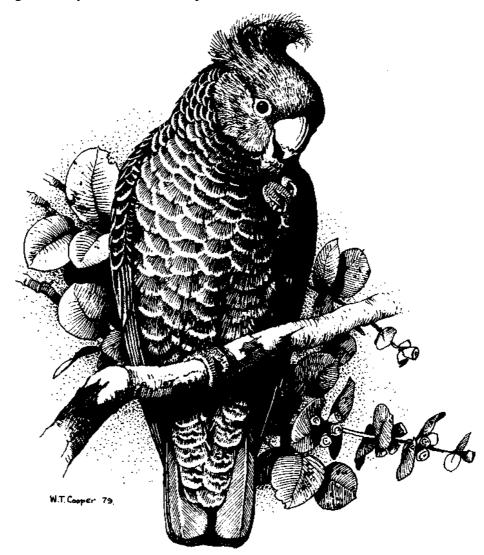
CANBERRA BIRD NOTES

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ANNUAL BIRD REPORT: 1 JULY 1984 TO 30 JUNE 1985

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INTRODUCTION

This report contains records of species that occurred in the Canberra Ornithologists Group Area of Concern as defined in the Field List of the Birds of Canberra and District, (3rd edition, 1985).

A total of 217 species was recorded in 1984-85, 135 of these were recorded in the Garden Bird Survey. Breeding activity was recorded for 77 species. All records have been vetted by the COG Rarities Committee.

The names and sequence of birds conform with the RAOU's `Recommended English Names for Australian Birds', *Emu* 77,' Supplement (May 1978), with orders and family groupings arranged; according to convenience.

The species listed in the report and the status assigned to, each have been revised in the light of the Field List. The status of each species has been given in an abbreviated form. The conventional definition of each status has remained unchanged (see CBN 9[3]:53). The status of each bird consists of two elements, abundance and breeding status, separated by a period. See Abbreviations section for details.

Chris Davey wrote the sections dealing with waterbirds, from data prepared by Michael Lenz, John Gibson compiled the miscellaneous landbird records and Ian Taylor analysed the data from the Garden Bird Survey and acted as co-ordinator.

HIGHLIGHTS

The highlights of the 1984-85 bird-watching year include the following:

- 1. A substantial increase in the numbers of both waterbirds and landbirds after a poor year in 1983-84.
- 2. An unprecedented irruption of crakes and rails in late] January at Kelly's Swamp, including the first Lewin's Rail since 1972, the first Buff-banded Rail and Australian Crake since 1981 and unusual records of Baillon's end Spotless Crake.
- 3. Records of the following rare and uncommon species: Lesser Golden Plover, Marsh Sandpiper, Whiskered and Gull-billed Terns, Little Lorikeet, Little Cuckoo-shrike, Black-faced Monarch and Regent Honeyeater.

- 4. Regular records of Spotted Harriers at Lake Bathurst, where they may be breeding.
- 5. A flock of 8500 Grey Teal on Lake George in November. On Lake Bathurst, 295 Musk Duck in April and 3255 Pink-eared Duck in June. A total of 75 Red-necked Avocets on Lake George in June the highest number ever recorded in the Canberra area.
- 6. An irruption of Barn Owls in the spring following the mouse plague, the first records since 1982.
- 7. Substantial increases in the numbers of Spotted and Striated Pardalotes after very low numbers in 1982-83 and 1983-84.
- 8. Remarkable increases in the numbers of Weebills, Brown, Buff-rumped and Striated Thornbills during 1984-85.
- 9. Records of the Common Myna in Acton and O'Connor, indicating a further expansion of the range of this species.
- 10. Further breeding records for the Great Crested Grebe, Little Bittern, Blue-billed Duck, Coot and Yellow Thornbill.

METEOROLOGY

Rainfall in the Canberra region during the winter was much higher than the long-term winter average. Spring and summer rainfalls were well below average when temperatures were higher than usual. Conditions in the remaining months were close to the average. Rainfall and temperature for 1984-85 are shown in Fig.1.

FIG 1a). Rainfall





FIG 1b). Temperature



WATERBIRD SURVEY

The Waterbird Survey (WBS) data were collected in bimonthly visits to the urban lakes and monthly visits to Lake Bathurst. Data from the silt-trap on Tuggeranong Ck and Village Dam on Village Ck are included under the heading Tuggeranong Lakes. There were partial surveys of the north-west corner of Lake George in November 1984 and June 1985. Water levels of Lake Bathurst and Lake George rose to a peak in December, and declined again thereafter (see Table 1).

All lakes appeared to hold larger numbers of species and individuals than in 1983-84. The Tuggeranong lakes had the same number of species as the much larger Lake Ginninderra. Lake Burley Griffin had twice as many species as the other two urban lakes (see Table 2 below). Waterbird species are listed in Tables 3-7.

Unlike previous years, the number of birds on Lake Bathurst did not show any seasonal trend, but all urban lakes showed considerable increases in numbers from December onwards. The number of waterbird species breeding in the local area was similar to 1983-84.

Waterbird numbers from Lakes Bathurst, George, Burley Griffin, Ginninderra and Tuggeranong are shown in Tables 3-7. An asterisk (*) after a figure indicates non-flying young present but not included; figures in parentheses indicate incomplete data.

GARDEN BIRD SURVEY

Total species

The Garden Bird survey (GBS) is based on data collected on Garden Bird Charts. A description of survey techniques may be found in CBN 8(1):5. Ninety charts were received for 1984-85, 84 of which were analysed. Three charts were received from country areas. Data from these has been incorporated with the miscellaneous records in the section entitled 'Other'. A further three charts were received after analysis was completed. Survey sites are shown on Fig. 3. Fifty-three of these sites were also surveyed in 1983-84.

A number of elements of previous years' GBS results have been dropped. The three values N,C, and S have been omitted from this year's GBS results as most species are evenly spread throughout the city. The index T has been replaced by a simple

average A as described below. Two new variables W and R have been introduced.


- is the average number of birds of a particular species seen per garden per week. To compare this year's figures with the value T used in previous years, simply multiply A by 120. A is calculated by adding all weekly observations of a particular species and dividing the sum by the total number of weeks during which observations were made (3287). E.g. A=5.1 indicates that an average of 5.1 birds of that species was recorded per garden per week. Each garden area is approximately 3.1 ha.
- F is unchanged from 1983-84. It is the frequency of each species, expressed as the percentage of all gardens in which each species was recorded at least once. If a species is described as 'F=10%', it was recorded in 10% of gardens.
- W is the number of weeks during which each species was recorded. Resident species such as the Australian Magpie are present 52 weeks of the year (W=52); but a migrant such as the Dollarbird is only present during 26 weeks (W=26).
- R is the recording rate, i.e., the number of observer-weeks on which a species was recorded, divided by the total number of observer-Weeks (3287), expressed as a percentage. E.g., the Common Starling was recorded during three-quarters of observer-weeks (R=76%). This means that on a typical chart, one could expect to record starlings on 76% of weeks during which observations were made.

The values described above have been omitted for a small number of species which were only recorded once or twice during the GBS.

The first and last records of nests (n) and dependent fledglings (f) are given and the areas where breeding activity was recorded are listed.

The relative abundance of each species (A) and the percentage change on 1983-84 (dA) are shown in Table 8. For species where A is less than 0.01, dA ceases to be useful and is not given.

Species recorded in the GBS are ranked by frequency in Table 9. The percentage figure represents the percentage of survey sites in which the species was recorded (F).

OTHER SURVEYS

Surveys of avifauna at the proposed Museum of Australia Site at Yarramundi Reach on Lake Burley Griffin, the Museum Site Survey, (MSS) were completed in January 1985. Features of the surveys conducted between July 1984 and January 1985 have been included in this report. The initial survey of the Inner Corridor of the Murrumbidgee River was carried out in June 1985. Some data from that survey has also been incorporated.

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Graham Barwell brought the status of each species into line with those given in the Field List and Philip Veerman arranged the family groupings and the placement of foreign species. Huw Prendergast and Terry Lindsey kindly read and commented on early drafts of this report.

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This report would not have been possible without the contributions from over 100 COG members, in the form of Garden Bird Charts, personal observations, as members of Waterbird, Museum or Murrumbidgee survey teams or as the dedicated data entry operators, particularly Pat Mooney, who typed the 150 000 items of garden bird data. NOTES ON THE PEACEFUL DOVE, DIAMOND DOVE AND OTHER UNCOMMON SPECIES NEAR CANBERRA

On 17 March 1986, Michael Wright, Roger Green and I visited an area of dry sclerophyll open forest near Kirawin homestead on Mountain Creek Road, about 35 km northwest of Canberra. The 1 ha site was bordered by the road on one side and by a creek on the other. It was fairly steep; there was some scrub in the lower part of the site, but for the most part, there was little understorey. Near one end of the site was a deep man-made trench. Although there had been almost no rain in the preceding two months, the trench still held a small pool.

The remarkable thing about this site was the number of rare and unusual birds it contained. In addition to two species not in the ACT Field List, there was one species with a report status of 3 and two With report status 2.

Some weeks earlier, while photographing Diamond Firetails, Michael had discovered and photographed a Diamond Dove's nest containing a typical clutch of two eggs. This dove is a rare vagrant in the Canberra area and this constitutes the first breeding record in the COG area of concern. we now returned to see how the young from this nest were progressing.

Before We had left the car, a pair of small doves were flushed from the side of the track to a low branch about 15m away where we could have a good look at them. The birds had fine barring on the neck and throat, and strong black scalloping on the wings: they were clearly Peaceful Doves, not the Diamond Doves we had been expecting. All around the area, during the hour we spent there, we heard the constant, placid call of this species, 'coo-la-coo, coo-la-coo'. We estimated that there Was a minimum of six individuals in the area.

The Peaceful Dove was once common along the Murrumbidgee. Lamm and Calaby (1950) recorded it there frequently during their surveys in the late 1940s. There are very few recent records, and there is a tendency to discount Peaceful Doves near Canberra as escapees. The presence of a substantial wild colony near Canberra may require the status of Peaceful Doves to be reconsidered.

We easily located the immature Diamond Doves. They had left the nest. The 'diamonds' on their wings - tiny white spots - were clearly visible. A little later we saw an adult with a bright red eye-ring. This species is indeed rare in our area. There have been a handful of records in recent years, but like the Peaceful Dove these have mostly been dismissed as escapees. Jones (1929) included them in his list of the birds of Duntroon. The RAOU Atlas (Blakers, et al. 1985), shows no records near Canberra, and even more surprisingly, there are only four grid areas in the whole of NSW where breeding was recorded.

A little distance further, we heard a Brown Treecreeper calling and watched it feeding. This is another species that was once common around Canberra. Barrett (1922) stated that they were abundant at the Tuggeranong homestead. Lamm and Calaby (1950) found it more common than the White-throated Treecreeper along the Murrumbidgee. COG's current survey of the birds of the Murrumbidgee has located the White-throated Treecreeper at nearly all of the 18 survey sites, but the Brown has not yet been found. The species appears to have retreated to undisturbed Woodland areas such as Castle Hill where it is recorded regularly (R.Mason pers. comm.)

All around we could hear the distinctive rising whistle of the Diamond Firetail, and although we only glimpsed a few, on previous visits Michael had recorded up to 16 birds. Jones (1929) and Mathews (1943) mention this species, but the strongest evidence for its decline comes again from Lamm and Calaby (1950) who found an average of 140 birds per visit in spring and summer. COG surveys of the same area have failed to locate the species so far. The chief attraction for the firetails and the doves seems to be the permanent water supply.

We had excellent views of a Jacky Winter foraging in the dense foliage of a eucalypt. Both Barrett (1922) and Jones (1929) recorded the bird near Canberra, but it is generally thought to have declined in recent years. Frith (1984) calls it uncommon, but the Field List shows it as rare.

Just as we were about to leave, I heard a low bubbling call that reminded me of a Blackbird. This was followed by a musical piping. Michael Was able to whistle the birds down to within 5m of us. They were Crested Shrike-tits, an uncommon bird which is only reported two or three times per year.

The occurrence of six uncommon species, four of which were once comparatively numerous in Canberra, made this a most interesting site.
