ANNUAL BIRD REPORT: 1 JULY 1992 TO 30 JUNE 1993

Introduction

This Annual Bird Report summarises all records of species that occurred in the Canberra region, as defined by the Canberra Ornithologists Group (COG), between 1 July 1992 and 30 June 1993. The Canberra region is the description given by COG to its area of interest. The boundaries of the area lie along lines of latitude 34° 45' and 36° 00' S, and longitude 148° 40' and 149° 45' E (see Appendix 3, Map 1).

A grid system is used for the collection and recording of information in the COG Database of Bird Observations. To achieve this the Canberra region is divided into 780 grid cells, each of 2.5 minutes of latitude and longitude. Each grid cell is identified by an alpha-numeric code, A to Z across the region from west to east and 1 to 30 from north to south. For example, Lake Ginninderra lies in grid cell J12. The location of the grid cells is shown in Appendix 3, Map 2.

The goal for COG will be to systematically survey all 780 grid cells in the region on a continuing basis. In 1992-93 members collected data from 191 cells (compared with 215 in 1991-92). The locations of these cells are shown in Appendix 3, Map 3. Observers provided details of their observations on 689 record sheets (compared with 740 in 1991-92).

There were 210 species recorded in the region during the twelve month period to 30 June 1993 (compared with 219 in 1991-92).

All records for Status 3 species, as defined in A Field List of the Birds of Canberra and

District (Canberra Ornithologists Group 1985), included in this report, have been examined and endorsed by the COG Rarities Panel. A number of reported sightings of Status 3 species were not referred to the Rarities Panel by the observers and so, not being endorsed, are not included in this report. They are, nevertheless, retained in the COG database as unconfirmed records and may subsequently be endorsed if they are submitted to the Rarities Panel.

Highlights of the Year

The highlights of the 1992-93 year in the Canberra region included:

- an unusual sighting of an Emu *Dromaius* novaehollandiae at Lake Bathurst;
- a large influx of Freckled Ducks Stictonetta naevosa at Lake George in May and June;
- a Red Knot Calidris canutus at Lake Bathurst, only the second record for the region;
- a Buff-breasted Sandpiper *Tryngites* subruficollis at Lake Bathurst, the first reported sighting of this species for the Canberra region;
- further evidence of the rapidly increasing population of the Crested Pigeon *Ocyphaps lophotes* in Canberra;
- further records of the Chestnut-rumped Heathwren *Hylacola pyrrhopygia* this year close to Canberra;
- evidence that numbers of the Rufous Whistler *Pachycephala rufiventris* continue to fall; and
- the first reported sighting for the region of a Red-whiskered Bulbul *Pycnonotus jocosus*.

Rainfall and Temperature




Figure 1. Monthly rainfall figures for 1992–93 and long-term averages.

The total rainfall for the year was 768 mm (Figure 1), up on the previous year (672 mm), and well above the long-term yearly average of 633 mm. While spring and summer rains were generally higher than the long-term average, substantially so for

November, January and March, falls for the cooler months of July, April, May and June were well down on the averages for those months.




Figure 2. Monthly average maximum and minimum temperatures for 1992–93 and long-term averages.

Average monthly temperatures were largely consistent with long-term figures (Figure 2).

Sources of Data

Data for this report were obtained from four sources:

a) Garden Bird Survey

The Garden Bird Survey (GBS) data are derived from standard charts on which participants record observations on a weekly basis at sites throughout suburban Canberra. Observers record the maximum number of each species seen at any one time during a week within a radius of 100 m of their home or workplace. A detailed description of the GBS has been made by Hermes (1981). Sixty-five charts were received for 1992-93 (compared with 61 in 1991-92). The approximate locations of the sites are shown in Appendix 3, Map 4.

One hundred and twenty-nine species were recorded on GBS charts submitted for 1992-93. This figure does not include a number of

unconfirmed records of Status 3 species. Statistical values of abundance (A), distribution (F), presence (W), recording rate (R) and group size (G) for these species are shown in Table 1 together with the percentage change in these values when compared with the average of the previous year (1991-92). The methods used to calculate these values are described in Appendix 1.

Histograms beside the text for a species indicate the average monthly number of individuals recorded in each GBS area per observer-week. The greatest monthly A value has been used to determine the vertical scale of each histogram. Therefore, when comparing histograms from different years and/or species, allowance should be made for differences in this scale. For selected species, histograms have been provided for each of the past four years. These are all to the same vertical scale to enable them to be more easily compared.

b) Waterbird Survey

Data on the number of waterbirds present were collected during monthly surveys of Lake Bathurst (including The Morass) and Lake George. The survey includes visits to three locations at Lake Bathurst and to two locations at Lake George. Surveys were not completed at all locations at Lake Bathurst in August, February, March, April, May and June and at Lake George in July and August. Altogether 1464 records involving 110 species were received for the year.

The two-monthly surveys of Canberra's urban lakes have now ceased. Those at Lake Burley Griffin and Lake Ginninderra commenced in July 1979 and finished in June 1989. The survey of Lake Tuggeranong, including associated ponds and dams, commenced in July 1984 and finished in June 1991.

Details of water levels, together with the number of waterbird species and the number of individuals counted on Lake Bathurst and Lake George are shown in Table 2.

c) Miscellaneous Records

This category of records includes all observations from the Canberra region that were not collected specifically for the Waterbird or Garden Bird Surveys.

In addition to storing the records of specific surveys, the COG Database of Bird Observations includes numerous records collected by members and other interested enthusiasts.

The miscellaneous records form the bulk of the year's data and so represent an important source for the information COG needs to pursue its objective of promoting the conservation of our native birds and their habitat. For the year 1992-93 there were 8600 miscellaneous records involving 193 species

Appendix 1. Explanatory Notes, Statistical Methods, Abbreviations and Observer Codes

a) Explanatory Notes

The names and sequence of birds in the Systematic List conform to the RAOU's Monograph 2, *The Taxonomy and Species of Birds of Australia and its Territories* (Christidis and Boles 1994).

The status shown for each bird in this report takes account of results of the 1986-89 `Atlas' survey of the ACT and other data currently available. The status is given in an abbreviated form and consists of two elements, abundance and breeding/presence, the codes for each being separated by a period (e.g. C.BR). The meanings of the abbreviations are shown in section c) of this appendix.

As applicable, information relating to each species is in the sequence: Garden Bird Survey (GBS), Waterbird Survey (WBS) and miscellaneous records (Misc).

As a general rule records are set out in the following format: number of individuals/date, place, grid (observer). For example, '6/25 Mar Rose Lagoon GrU4 (LaB)', indicates 6 birds on 25 March at Rose Lagoon grid cell U4 and the observer was Brenda Lappski. Breeding records are indicated by an 'ne' (nest with eggs) or 'dy' (dependent young), or other abbreviation as appropriate, which take the place of the number of individuals. For breeding records of cuckoos, the host species, if recorded, is shown in brackets immediately following the breeding indicator e.g. dy(White-plumed Honeyeater)/12 Dec.

The words 'record(s)' and `observation(s)' are not used to indicate the number of birds

involved. Where available and appropriate the number of individuals has been included.

In cases where the observer has been unable to make an accurate count of the birds present the following abundance codes may have been used to indicate estimated numbers — A=1 to 5 birds, B=6 to 20, C=21 to 50, D=51 to 100, E=100 plus, or simply X=present.

Numbers and distribution of birds are sometimes compared with the previous year. Therefore, unless indicated otherwise, a statement in this report such as 'overall numbers lower' should be taken to mean lower than in 1991-92.

Garden Bird Survey data are often in the form '2wk May', '2wk' referring to the second week of the month. The dates of each week are shown at the top of the survey chart and also listed by Taylor (1987).

When sufficient data are available, breeding records giving the first and last nest and/or dependent young records have been included.

In Table 2 and in the tables of waterbird numbers included in the Systematic List, numbers which are underlined indicate that the lake was only partly surveyed. Figures in *bold italics* indicate breeding (including non-flying young present but their numbers not included in totals).

b) Garden Bird Survey Statistics

The following variables are summarised for all species in Table 1:

- A Measure of abundance. This is the average number of individuals of a species recorded at a site for each week over the full year. It is obtained by adding all weekly observations of a species and dividing the sum by the total number of weeks during which observations were made 2711 hours this year. If A=5.1 then on average, 5.1 individuals of that species were recorded each week, at each site, over the full year.
- F Measure of distribution. This the number of sites at which a species was recorded at least once expressed as a percentage of the total number of sites 65 sites this year. If F=26.2% then a species has been recorded, at least once, at 17 sites (i.e. 26.2 per cent of the 65 sites).
- W Number of weeks in the year for which a species has been recorded at any site. A resident species such as the Galah is present throughout the year, so W=52; whereas a migrant such as the Olivebacked Oriole, was only present for 32 weeks, i.e. W=32.
- R Measure of the recording rate. This is the number of observer-weeks during which a species was recorded, expressed as a percentage of the total number of observer-weeks for the year, ie. 2711. For example, the Australian Magpie was recorded during 2280 of the weeks during which observations were made, thus R = 84.10%.
- G Average number of individuals of a species recorded in each observation. For example, the calculated G value for the Silver Gull is 61.15, which indicates it is usually observed in sizeable flocks.

In Table 1 'N/A' in the columns listing percentage changes in the above values (e.g.

dA%), indicates that there were no records for that species in the previous year (1991-92) for comparison.

GBS: Recorded consistently at 1 site in Acton GrK13 from wk Jul to 5wk Jan. Records at 9 other sites almost entirely confined to 2wk Mar to 4wk Jun. Apart from the indicator of the number of weeks recorded (W), values were down. Following high levels in 1990-91 (0.48) and 1991-92 (0.35), abundance (A) fell to a level more consistent with those recorded between 1984-90. A=0.1852, F=15.4, W=47, R=2.36, G=7.84. **WBS:** Records from LGeoS GrR11 in Jul and Aug (LeB).





STARLING AND MYNA

Common Starling Sturnus vulgaris

GBS: Remains by far Canberra's most common bird. Recorded at 98.5% of sites during all weeks of the year. However, abundance (A) shows a small decline over the past eight years (1984-85 A=13.10, 1987-88 =12.02, 1991-92 =11.77, 1992-93 =10.75) Distribution (F) and recording rate (R), remain unchanged. Breeding recorded at 14 sites.

WBS: Usually present at LBth, The Morass and LGeo. Largest number 400/24 Jan LBthE GrY8 (LeM).

Misc: 199 non-breeding records. 12 breeding records.




GBS: An uncharacteristic drop in the abundance value (A) following marked increases since 1984-85 A=0.584, 1986-87 A=0.660, 1988-89 =1.202, 1991-92 =3.729. Distribution, however, continues to expand — 1984-85 F=33, 1986-87 =34.83, 1988-89 =46.4, 1991-92 =70.5. The recording rate (R) has also risen by 150% since 1984-85 R=18. A=2.1505, F=76.9%, W=52 R=45.08%, G=4.77. Breeding recorded at 7 sites.

Appendix 3. Maps of the Canberra region, grid system and Garden Bird Survey sites.




Map 1. The Canberra region.
