ANNUAL BIRD REPORT: 1 JULY 1997 TO 30 JUNE 1998

Canberra Ornithologists Group PO Box 301, Civic Square, ACT 2608

Introduction

This report summarises all records of species that occurred in the Canberra region, as defined by the Canberra Ornithologists Group (COG), between 1 July 1997 and 30 June 1998. The Canberra region is the description given by COG to its area of interest. The boundaries of the area lie along lines of latitude 34° 45' and 36° 00' S and longitude 148° 40' and 149° 45' E (see Appendix 4, Map 1).

A grid system is used for the collection and recording of information in the COG Database of Bird Observations. To achieve this the Canberra region is divided into 780 grid cells, each of 2.5 minutes of latitude and longitude. Each grid cell is identified by an alpha-numeric code, A to Z across the region from west to east and 1 to 30 from north to south. For example, the township of Gunning is situated in grid cell O1. The location of the grid cells is shown in Appendix 4 (Map 2). The goal for COG will be to systematically survey all 780 grid cells in the region on a continuing basis.

There were 210 species recorded in the region in the twelve-month period to 30 June 1998. This compares with 217 species recorded in the two previous twelve-month periods to 30 June 1996 and to 30 June 1997.

In 1993 COG undertook a review of the status in the Canberra region of a number of species previously classified as Status 3, as defined in *A Field List of the Birds of Canberra and District* (Canberra Ornithologists Group 1985). The outcome was the introduction of the COG 'List of

Unusual Birds', having effect from 1 July 1993 (Anon 1993) (see Appendix 5). Observers who record sightings of species included on the list, or which have not previously been recorded from the Canberra region, are asked to submit an Unusual Record Report to the COG Rarities Panel so that the sightings can be endorsed as COG records.

All records of 'unusual birds' included in this report, have been examined and endorsed by the COG Rarities Panel. A number of reported sightings were not referred to the Rarities Panel by the observers and so, not being endorsed, are not included in this report. They are, nevertheless, retained in the COG database as unconfirmed records.

Highlights

The highlights for the year in the Canberra region included:

- the first reported sighting of a Spotless Crake *Porzana tabuensis* since 1991;
- the first reported sighting for the region of the White-headed Pigeon *Columba leucomela*;
- a record of the Channel-billed Cuckoo Scythrops novaehollandiae, the last being in 1996;
- the first reported sighting of a Barking Owl *Ninox connivens* since 1987;
- the first reported breeding of Australian White Ibises *Threskiornis molucca* in the ACT;
- the first reported breeding of Royal Spoonbills *Platalea regia* in the region;

• a further record of the Bell Miner *Manorina melanophrys*, first reported in the region in January 1994.

Rainfall and Temperature




Figure 1. Monthly rainfall figures for 1997–98 and long-term averages.

The total rainfall for the twelve months to 30 June 1998 was 439 mm (Figure 1), substantially lower than the previous two years (1995-96. 645 mm. 1996-97. 675

mm), and also well below the long-term yearly average of 630 mm. Only for the months of September, April and June did falls reach or exceed average figures.




Figure 2. Monthly average maximum and minimum temperatures for 1997-98 and long-term averages.

The average monthly temperatures were largely above the long-term figures, with the exception of the 1997 winter minimums which were below (Figure 2).

Sources of Data

Data for this report were obtained from four sources:

a) Garden Bird Survey

The Garden Bird Survey (GBS) data are derived from standard charts on which participants record observations on a weekly basis at sites throughout suburban Canberra. Observers record the maximum number of each species seen at any one time during a week within a radius of 100 metres of their home or workplace (3.1 ha). A detailed description of the Garden Bird Survey has been made by Hermes (1981).

Completed charts were received for 52 sites for the year 1997-98 and together they contained records of 130 species (1995-96: 43 charts, 137 species; 1996-97: 43 charts 131 species). This figure does not include records involving 'unusual birds' which have not been endorsed by the Rarities Panel.

Statistical values of abundance (A), distribution (F), presence (W), recording rate (R), and group size (G) together with the percentage change in these values when compared with the average of the previous year are shown in Appendix 3. The methods used to calculate these values are described in Appendix 1.

Graphs beside the text for selected species in the systematic list indicate the average yearly number of individuals recorded in each GBS survey site per observer-week (`A' value) and/or its distribution ('F' value) for the years since 1984-85. Histograms indicate the average number of individuals recorded in each site per observer-week for the year under review. The greatest 'A' value has been used to determine the vertical scale of each graph or histogram. Therefore,

when making comparisons for different species, allowance should be made for differences in this scale.

b) Mulligans Flat Survey

In June 1995 COG began collecting data on bird species and abundance in Mulligans Flat Nature Reserve, a largely intact remnant of Yellow Box alliance woodland, situated on the northern outskirts of Canberra.

The survey presents an opportunity to monitor the effect of encroaching urban development on the bird fauna during the next 10 to 15 years. In 1995 the urban area of Gungahlin was approximately 3 kilometres distant, separated from the reserve by grazed paddocks. Eventually housing will reach to the edge of the reserve on all but the northern boundary, the New South Wales border.

Surveys are conducted in September, November, December, March and June, at twenty-four sites within the reserve. The number of birds seen or heard within a radius of fifty metres during a period of fifteen minutes, is recorded.

c) Waterbird Survey

Data on the number of waterbirds present are collected during monthly surveys of Lake Bathurst (including The Morass) and Lake George. The survey involves visits to three locations at Lake Bathurst and to two locations at Lake George.

Waterbird surveys are regularly undertaken towards the end of each month. Occasionally circumstances prevent a survey being undertaken within the designated month. If such a situation arises the survey may still be undertaken within the first few days of the following month. For example, some of the January 1998 counts at Lake

Bathurst were actually done on 1 February. For survey purposes data collected in these cases will be regarded as applying to the month in which collection should have occurred and be included in this report accordingly. However, if used for other purposes those data appear in the COG database as February records.

Major road works commenced on the western shore of Lake George during the latter part of 1995. At the same time the level of Lake George steadily fell during the months that followed. As a result surveys were severely interrupted and this year were

only undertaken during the months August, September, November and December 1997. Following the dry period to June 1997, water returned to Lake Bathurst and The Morass and surveys recommenced in July. However, although they continued for most of the year at The Morass, the east and west basins of the main lake again dried up and there were no surveys there for the months February to June 1998.

Details of water levels, together with the number of waterbird species and the number of individuals counted on Lake Bathurst and Lake George are shown in Table 1.

Table 1. Water levels at Lake George and number of waterbird species and individuals recorded at Lake Bathurst (including The Morass) and Lake George. Monitoring of water levels at Lake Bathurst and The Morass ceased in June 1994.

In the table of waterbird numbers, the figures which are <u>underlined</u> indicate that the lake was only partly surveyed. The symbol O'' indicates that no surveys were undertaken at any site at the lake for the month.

d) Miscellaneous Records

The Miscellaneous category of records includes all observations from the Canberra region that were not collected specifically for one of the COG surveys (i.e. Garden Bird Survey, Mulligans Flat Survey or Waterbird Survey).

In addition to storing the records of specific surveys, the COG Database of Bird

Observations includes numerous records collected by members and other interested enthusiasts.

Miscellaneous records form the bulk of the year's data and so represent an important source for the information COG needs to pursue its objective of promoting the conservation of our native birds and their habitat.

Appendix 1. Explanatory Notes, Statistical Methods, Abbreviations, and Observer Codes

a) Explanatory Notes

The names and sequence of birds in the Systematic List conform to the RAOU's Monograph 2, *The Taxonomy and Species of Birds of Australia and its Territories* (Christidis and Boles 1994).

The status shown for each bird in this report takes account of results of the 1986-89 `Atlas' survey of the ACT and other data currently available. The status is given in an abbreviated form and consists of two elements, abundance and breeding/presence, the codes for each being separated by a period (e.g. C.BR). The meanings of the abbreviations are shown in section c) of this appendix.

As applicable, information relating to each species is in the sequence: Garden Bird Survey (GBS), Mulligans Flat Survey (MFS), Waterbird Survey (WBS) and miscellaneous records (Misc).

As a general rule records are set out in the following format: number of individuals/date, place, grid (observer). For example, '4/15 Jun ANBG GrK13 (WiJ)', indicates four birds on 15 June at Australian National Botanic Gardens grid cell K13 and the observer was Jacqi Winter. Breeding records are indicated by an 'ne' (nest with eggs) or 'dy' (dependent young), or other abbreviation as appropriate, which take the place of the number of individuals. For breeding records of cuckoos, the host species, if recorded, is shown in brackets immediately following the breeding (White-plumed indicator e.g. Honeyeater)/18 Dec.

The words 'record(s)' and `observation(s)' are not used to indicate the number of birds

involved. Where available and appropriate the number of individuals has been included.

In cases where the observer has been unable to make an accurate count of the birds present the following abundance codes may have been used to indicate estimated numbers: A=1 to 5 birds; B=6 to 20; C=21 to 50; D=51 to 100; E= 100 plus; or simply X= present.

Numbers and distribution of birds are sometimes compared with the previous year. Therefore, unless indicated otherwise, a statement in this report such as 'overall numbers lower' should be taken to mean lower than in the immediately preceding year.

Garden Bird Survey data are often in the form '2wk May', '2wk' referring to the second week of the month. The dates of each week are shown at the top of the survey chart and also listed by Taylor (1987).

When sufficient data are available, breeding records giving the first and last nest and/or dependent young records have been included.

In Table 1 and in the table of waterbird numbers included in the Systematic List, numbers which are <u>underlined</u> indicate that the lake was only partly surveyed. Figures in *bold italics* indicate breeding (including non-flying young present but their numbers not included in totals).

b) Garden Bird Survey Statistics

The following variables are summarised in Appendix 3 for all species:

- A Measure of abundance. This is the average number of individuals of a species recorded at a site for each week over the full year. It is obtained by adding all weekly observations of a species and dividing the sum by the total number of weeks during which observations were made. For 1997-98 the total number of weeks during which observations were made was 2215. For that year the total number of Eastern Spinebills recorded was 1542. Therefore the average number of that species seen each week, at each site, over the full year (A) was 0.6962.
- F Measure of distribution. This is the number of sites at which a species was recorded at least once expressed as a percentage of the total number of sites. In 1997-98 there were 52 sites and the White-throated Needletail was recorded at least once at 13 of them. So, for the White-throated Needletail the value of F for the year is 25.0%.
- W Number of weeks in the year for which a species has been recorded at any site. In 1997-98 a resident species such as the Crested Pigeon was present throughout the year, so W=52; whereas a migrant such as the Dollarbird, was present only for 24 weeks, i.e. W=24.
- R Measure of the recording rate. This is the number of observer-weeks during which a species was recorded, expressed as a percentage of the total number of observer-weeks for the year. For example, in 1997-98 the Noisy Miner was recorded during only 86 of the weeks during which observations were made. Since the total number of observer weeks for the year was 2215, for the Noisy Miner R=3.9%.

G Average number of individuals of a species recorded in each observation. For example, in 1997-98 the calculated G value for the Silver Gull was 167.0, this is an indication that the Silver Gull was usually observed in sizeable flocks.

In Appendix 3 'N/A' in the columns listing percentage changes in the above values (e.g. dA%), indicates that there were no records for that species in the previous year for comparison.


