#### BIRD REPORT 1 JULY 1980 TO 30 JUNE 1981

### 1. General

The report year was the third in a row of drought years. The brown countryside, increasing numbers of eucalypts losing their foliage, and receding Lake George were obvious signs of the lack of rain. Our current level of systematic recording of the status of birds only allows us to measure the effect of these harsh conditions to be measured for a few groups of birds eg. waterbirds.

A number of new or rare species for our area were recorded: Little Bittern, Black-necked Stork (first ACT record), Black Falcon, Lesser Golden Plover, Common Koel (second record for region), Red-backed Kingfisher, Singing Bushlark, Black-faced Monarch (second ACT record), Brown Gerygone (first ACT record), Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater (second ACT record), Sharp-tailed Sandpiper and Red-necked Stint were observed during the winter, and unusual numbers of Blue-billed Ducks were seen at Lake Bathurst. White-winged Triller, Brown and Rufous Songlark and White-browed Woodswallows reached population levels not recorded for several years.

We can improve our prospect for monitoring bird population changes within and between years considerably with more systematic surveys. The Waterbird Survey now augmented (since 1 July 1981) by a Canberra-wide Garden Bird Survey (garden charts) and techniques to include various non-urban land habitats are currently being developed. This will mean that, more than in previous years, we will be utilising and depending on the voluntary co-operation of COG's members. The success of the various programmes rests entirely on the support, enthusiasm and endurance that our members are prepared to bring to the task. Even if you cannot participate in the field you could lend us a helping hand in processing the recorded observations. Any members who feel that they could assist in any way can contact any member of the committee who will be only too happy to discuss possible activities and projects.

The many contributions which enabled compiling of this report, clearly indicate the potential in the COG membership for outstanding bird recording. Very many thanks to all those who provided their notes and those who participated in the organised Waterbird Surveys (names marked with an asterisk).

Please submit your records for the next report (period 1 July 1981-30 June 1982), together with your Garden Charts to the Records Officer by mid-July 1982. Many thanks in advance!

The records on the following pages come from a variety of sources. The waterbirds are recorded in detail and figures quoted come from the regular and methodical bi-monthly lake surveys. Those wetland areas covered are Lake George (divided for many species into two - the main lake and the eastern wetlands) and Lake Ginninderra. Many common forest and garden species were observed methodically either on garden charts or transects. For those species other than waterbirds or those

regularly surveyed on garden or near-city transects records reported here are casual or chance observations. The most reliable data for illustrating seasonal fluctuations or indexing population numbers are the records of waterbirds or records that are indicated as coming from regular transect or garden counts.

Note: for some of the Lake Bathurst data surveys were not for the whole lake. These records are in brackets.

# Raptors - Breeding Records

The ACT Raptor Group has found a surprisingly large number of birds of prey nesting in two study sites in Canberra. The species recorded are Black-shouldered Kite, Brown Goshawk, Collared Sparrowhawk, Little Eagle, Australian Hobby, Brown Falcon, Australian Kestrel and, at other sites within the suburbs, Peregrine Falcon. Details are given elsewhere (J Olsen, CBN, 6 (1981) 78-79).

Collared Sparrowhawk Accipiter cirrhocephalus. 2 young of a suburban brood fledged 29 Nov (EMet).

Australian Hobby Falco longipennis. 3 young fledged from a nest (Raven nest on pylon) O'Con 30 Jan, family used nest until 22 Mar, last sighting 13 Apr, 1 juv of this nest banded (J Olsen) killed 3 May, Brisbane! (EMet).

Leaden Flycatcher *Myiagra rubecula*. One late record: 1M feeding 2 recently fledged juv 15 Feb Mt Ains (Lenz).

Restless Flycatcher Myiagra inquieta. Possible breeding record: 1/21 Feb near farm on Sutton-Queanbeyan Rd according to owner a pair present for some time, showing aggressive behaviour towards other birds (nest defence?) (JHol).

Grey Fantail Rhipidura fuliginosa. Some interesting records, one early two late: juv 28 Sep, LGin (RD); IP with 3 just fledged juv Feb; IP with 1 begging juv 31 Jan LGin (RD).

Willie Wagtail Rhipidura leucophrys. 2 successful broods of 3, nest in Pyracantha, Red Hill (MW); IP arrived 15 Oct, 2 juv left nest 22 Nov, 2nd brood left nest 18 Jan, Chapman (JHol).

Clamorous Reed-Warbler Acrocephalus stentoreus. Little Grassbird Megalurus gramineus. Singing males recorded during WBS 26 Oct, 4 LBG, E, 3 LGin, 4 LBG (3 areas), 1 LGin.

Rufous Songlark *Cinclorhamphus mathewsi*. Despite influx, hardly any information on breeding; IP, possibly with young Federal HW/Anthill St (Lenz); 1M 6 Sep to 9 Nov without attracting F Chapman (JHol).

Western Gerygone  $Gerygone \ fusca-$  One record: IP with nest MMar, later gave up Campbell/Mt Ains (SMat).

White-throated Gerygone *Gerygone olivacea*. One record: IP building nest 15 Dec, IP + fledged juv 21 Feb Red Hill (MW).

Yellow-rumped Thornbill Acanthiza chrysorrhoa 2P with young, Chapman (5P previous year) (JHol).

Yellow Thornbill *Acanthiza. nana.* First breeding record for area: IP feeding juv in nest 31 Jan, 1 ad + 1 fledged juv 13 Feb ANU (Lenz) (see also CBN 6 (1981) 101).

Noisy Friarbird *Philemon corniculatus*. Interesting observation: 1 bird taking nesting material from an abandoned nest of Red Wattlebird 1 Nov, Chapman (JHol).

White-eared Honeyeater *Lichenostomus leucotis*. Two interesting observations: 1/25 Jan carrying food (breeding?) LGin (RD); IP + 1 juv 30 Mar Condor Creek (breeding normally in Nov & Dec, see also CBN 6 (1981) 114) (Lenz).

Brown-headed Honeyeater *Melithreptus brevirostris*. 3 ad feeding recently fledged Pallid Cuckoo 2 Nov; IP feeding juv in nest 14 Feb Mt Ains, Pistol Club (see also CBN 6(1981) 116) (Lenz).

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis. Interesting observation: 7 nests in % acre area of eucalypt scrub, 6 Dec LGin, 3 nests contained 5, 5 & 3 eggs, species normally prefers exotic species for nesting (JD).

White-winged Chough Corcorax melanorhamphos. Records of flock size & number of fledged juv 3+2, 4+1, 5+2, 4+2, 5+3, 8+2, 5+4, 6+1, 12+4, 6+2, 6+2, 7+2 Nov to Mar, Mt Ains, ANU, BotG (Lenz).

White-browed Woodswallow Artamus superciliosus. Several breeding records: in many cases only a few pairs out of a larger flock nested successfully and in other cases only breeding attempts were made; 2 nests with 3 juv each Red Hill (MW); Narrabundah Lane, several birds one on nest 17 Nov, birds built up to 100+ & 2 nests

one with young 3 Dec, IP + 2 juv 5 Feb (Guy); large numbers feeding young 21-23 Dec Uriarra Crossing (RG-S); 5 nests each with up to 3 young 17 Dec Old Cootna Road, Qbyn, with flying young EJan (NH); regular Macs Reef Rd and Federal HW (Lenz, AD); 15P LNov to EJan Mt Ains, Pistol Club, not progressing beyond nest building, left area by 10 Jan (Lenz).

Dusky Woodswallow Artamus cyanopterus. Only few records available: IP with 3 newly fledged juv 25 Dec Black Mt Peninsula (AD); 3P (one with juv) 4 Jan Mt Ains Hopper, IP + 2 recently fledged juv 8 Feb Mt Ains, Fisher St (Lenz); several Narrabundah Lane, but left when White-browed Woodswallows arrived and built up in numbers (Guy); IP among White-browed Woodswallows Mt Ains, left area earlier than the White-browed Woodswallows (Lenz).

#### BIRDS OF NORTH-WESTERN MEXICO: PART 2

San Bias is a very old fishing village that is showing the first signs of becoming a tourist resort. Its greatest attraction to birdwatchers is its proximity to the Singaita Jungle and to the mangroves of the estuaries. On our first day the party travelled up the Estero de Key in two long dug-outs with local guides. The mangroves along the muddy banks are full of birds but this habitat is accessible only by boat.

Shortly after dawn we saw dozens of Yellow-crowned Night herons though all had retreated into the foliage by mid-morning. New birds were the Orange-crowned Parrot, Mangrove Warbler and Golden-checked Woodpecker and we had excellent views of an adult and immature Great Black Hawk which rejoice in the name Buteogallus urbitinga.

We had hoped to see Muscovy Ducks which are native to this area but unhappily have been almost wholly shot out. We could hear the guns of shooters further up river and see huge flocks of ducks wheeling in flight. We were delighted when we reached the swamp that was our goal to find large numbers of Fulvous and Blackbellied Treeducks that had not been disturbed. On the shore we got close-up views of the Collared Plover and Vermillion Flycatcher. On the return trip the uncommon Rufous-necked Wood Rail and Barethroated Tiger Heron were both seen and a further trip at dusk resulted in torchlight views of nearly a dozen Common Potoos.

The next day was spent in the Singaita Jungle, one of the northern outposts of true tropical jungle. In the morning, we drove to an abandoned coffee plantation in the upper jungle. Outstanding birds were the big Pale-billed and Lineated Woodpeckers, the tiny Blue-rumped Parrotlet, Tufted Flycatcher, Ivory-billed

Woodcreeper and Elegant Trogon. While the other members of the party were resting my roommate, an enthusiast birder from Kentucky, and I got a point-blank view of a Citreoline Trogon.

Later that day, and the following morning, we birded the denser lower jungle. Many of us had seed-ticks and chiggers to show for it. By the way, although I'd been regaled by stories of how maddening chigger bites were, I found it easy to ignore them. The yield - including Rufous-crowned Mot-mot, Grayish Saltator, Rose-throated Becard (a member of the Cotingidae that gets up into southern Texas) and Ferruginous Pygmy-Owl - made the bites worth-while.

Again my friend from Kentucky and I proved very lucky. The weird laughing calls of Collared Forest Falcons had been heard in the surrounding jungle but no-one had seen the bird. We were trying to squeak up the elusive Fan-tailed Warbler on a narrow jungle path when we heard a chunk. One of the falcons, a magnificent bird, had landed on a bough twenty metres off.

From San Bias we headed for the Hotel Villa Blanca, high in the Sierra Madre Occidental. Here the food (and beer) were German. The only thing that marred this delightful spot was the trucks. The hotel is located on the only road across the Sierra Madre for 1500 km south of the US border. And as Mexican trucks usually lack mufflers, we got little sleep. All night long we heard trucks grinding through the gears on the up-slope, then roaring downhill from the crest.

On the ridge-tops we were in pine and oak forest, with Nearctic birds; Red Warbler, Red-faced Warbler, Black-eared Bushtit, Mountain Trogon, Blue Mockingbird, Red-headed Tanager, Brown-backed Solitare and Rufous-capped Bush-finch. In the bottoms of the steep valleys or barrancas are Neotropical birds. But on the steep slopes of the barrancas, at the junction of the two major habitats, occurs a unique aggregation of plants and with them a small number of rare birds. All of the party got good views of the most famous of these; the big Tufted or Dickey's Jay, whose nearest relative lives in the high Andes. And right on the lip of the canyon, we found Aztec Thrushes, one of the two additions to Dan Lamm's 4,500 and life list.

One the way back down to the coast we were searching for Military Macaws, and finally got a distant look across a valley at a party of three birds. Feeling satisfied with this, we went to lunch at the little Village of Copala. When we came out, it was to find a tree full of the macaws, twenty metres from the restaurant.

The last full day's birding, in thick thorn scrub south of Mazatlan, brought probably the rarest bird of the whole trip; an immature Solitary Eagle. A male Red-breasted Ground Chat, a Fantailed Warbler (as last!) and a distant view of some Rufousbellied Chachalacas round out a most exciting trip.

#### BARREN GROUNDS OBSERVATORY TO OPEN IN MAY

The RAOU is pushing ahead to establish the first NSW bird observatory. They are planning to utilise the present unoccupied facilities at Barren Grounds Nature Reserve near Robertson, east of Mittagong. The first warden, Richard Jordan, is due to take up residence in May 1982. It is hoped that the observatory will be able to supply adequate but simple accommodation for up to 8 people from July 1982 onwards.

A series of proposals for ecological and ornithological projects has been prepared and they include regular censuses of the total bird population of the reserve and in particular the Ground Parrot and Eastern Bristlebird, sound recording and photography programmes and life-history studies of many of the common resident and migratory species using a number of techniques including banding.

It is anticipated that the RAOU will establish a management group for the Observatory and that COG members will be involved in an active way in the certain success of this project.

As in pratincole (= meadow dweller) the cola means inhabitant, so hylacola is a forest dweller (Greek hyle = wood or forest) and cisticola a bird which lives on the plants genus cistus.

Sitella can be spelt with a double t and is a diminutive of sitte, the Greek for woodpecker.

If the definition of species is that its members should under natural conditions interbreed and produce fertile offspring, I can not agree with G Tibicen that reef herons should be split by colour into 2 species. On Heron Island near Gladstone (which lives up to its name) we saw one bird of each colour sharing incubation and were told that mixed pairs were common.
